- * To develop 'local' relationships with other organisations and businesses to promote a wider understanding of the values of the Association and its potential to contribute to and educate the community.
- * To encourage and support the development of crafts, apprenticeships and skills within the community.
- * To take all measures to protect the use of the Royal Warrant from fraudulent misuse.
