# Karl-Ludwig Rehse MVO 1937-2019



In June we heard the sad news that our ex President (2012) Karl-Ludwig Rehse had passed away suddenly while on a holiday cruise in Greece. Many will remember Karl-Ludwig who was a very popular attendee at many events and council meetings for his bubbly character and impish nature.

Karl was born in Germany, and wanted to become a dressmaker but on being told that men could not become dressmakers he became an apprentice master tailor. He later moved to Munich where he passed the master exam in ladies' tailoring. In the 1960s he moved to London where he worked for John Cavanagh and Bellville

Sasson clothing stores and mastered the English language. In 1988 he went into business with his friend and partner John Anderson and their summer collection caught the eye of Her Majesty The Queen who

invited them to present it to her at Windsor Castle. This led to a long standing business relationship which has lasted over 30 years. When John Anderson died in 1996, Karl considered leaving the business, but after a personal conversation with the Queen, he felt encouraged to continue. Karl obtained his Royal Warrant in 2000 as the official supplier of Her Majesty The Queen and in 2007 he was also granted a Royal Warrant from the Queen Mother. In 2010, the City of London awarded him the Freedom of the City, and in 2015, Her Majesty The Queen made him an honorary Member of the Victoria Order.





Karl-Ludwig was always a smart and colourful dresser who was often caught taking note of the cut of other folk's clothes. Bright pastel colours were his trademark.

Windsor President, Alec McQuin: 'On the 14th June, together with Bernadette and other members of Windsor Association and the RWHA, we attended the service to commemorate our own Karl Ludwig Rehse MVO. The service was beautiful and a touching tribute to a great friend and fellow warrant holder. I had the privilege of saying a few words about Karl on behalf of the
